Fly tipping is a crime

If you dump rubbish you will face a fine of up to £50,000 or 6 months in prison.

Remember if you pay someone else to get rid of your rubbish <u>you are responsible</u> for where it is disposed and if it is fly tipped you could be prosecuted.

Always use a registered waste carrier.

Insist on seeing their Waste Carriers Licence. If they don't have a licence they are operating illegally.

You can also check that they are registered waste carriers with the Environment Agency at www.environment-agency.gov.uk/publicregister Or call 08708 505 506 (Mon-Fri 8am-6pm)

Speeding issues - policy

If speeding is raised as a priority, Police will:-

- Arrange for analysis of accident statistics in area to be conducted.
- Investigate possibility of speed survey.
- Conduct series of speed checks during relevant times to ascertain if speeding issue is genuine or perceived.
- Report back with results to next forum
- In addition forum can consider formation of / utilising Community Speed Watch (if sufficient interest from residents and site suitable) as education tool.

Stop and Search

Warwickshire Police operates a strict policy on stop and search of members of the public.

Police may stop and speak to any member of the public. Policy comes into being when officers detain a person for the purposes of searching.

Officers must have sufficient grounds for searching and give their details (exceptions occur under Terrorism Act, Collar Number) and reasons/grounds for search. A formal record is competed and retained, a copy of which is offered to the person searched.

All searches should be fair but effective; targeting especially specific areas associated with increased crime, e.g., autocrime in Atherstone and burglaries, Whitacre.

North Warwickshire has a small ethnic minority population of approx 2%, but is surrounded by areas with a higher % population, who use the main arterial routes through the area. This leads to an apparently high occurrence of stops of members of the ethnic minorities.
