Community Priorities

Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'

This may mean in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.

If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair of the panel

Safer Neighbourhood Priorities

- **High visibility patrols - Atherstone town centre**
(30 targeted patrols)
- **High visibility patrols - Mancetter**
(30 targeted patrols)
- **Anti-social behaviour – Chapel End**
(25 targeted patrols)

High-Visibility Patrols – Atherstone town

(30 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 149 targeted patrols conducted
 - Extensive engagement with the public, shops and public houses
 - Development of Shopwatch and WRCI for town centre
 - Increased CCTV awareness signage
 - Continuation of ticketing for illegal parking
 - Community engagement days

High Visibility Patrol - Mancetter

(30 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 78 targeted patrols conducted
 - Emphasis placed on Church Walk shops and Brook Walk
 - Joint work with council regarding Gramer Court
 - Resources directed to tackling graffiti problem
 - Positive action taken in addressing ASB at youth clubs
 - Engagement with local shops and public
 - Increased directed evening and night patrols
- 

Poactively deal with ASB at Chapel End

(25 patrols = 100% agreed Policing activity)

- 97 targeted patrols completed
 - Seizure of alcohol from youths in Chapel End area
 - Increased evening patrols with joint Nuneaton/North Warwickshire incentive
 - Licensing checks completed to specifically address ASB
 - Engagement with local shops and businesses

Safer Neighbourhoods

Solomon anti-social behaviour and alcohol awareness workshop.

- 93% of students understand more about how alcohol effects their decisions
- 77% of students stated they are responsible for their actions after they have drank alcohol
- 61% understand the effects of alcohol on their health following the presentation;
- 27% of the students stated they would drink less alcohol
- 34% said they do not drink ▪10% were unsure
- 22% said they would drink the same amount

Nuisance motorcycle campaign-Launched April

- Routes have been identified through Police reports
- Identified hotspot locations will have signage and will receive freepost postcards






Nuisance motorcycle
